Richard & Nancy Scheid's farm is located south of Hazen in central Mercer County. Along with their son Lee, they own and operate a very diversified operation with both crop and livestock. The Scheid's use no-till farming, cover crops, irrigation management and have utilized prescribed grazing practices



for over 10 years. In 2009, a permitted Waste Management System was constructed to background their calves. They have also installed several miles of shelterbelts, pipelines, and cross fencing to facilitate their rotational grazing. This family operation is striving to be sustainable for their future generations.

The Scheid's were guests of the Mercer County SCD at the NDASCD Annual Meeting in Bismarck. They received an aerial colored photo of their farmstead. We extend our congratulations to the Scheid's for their outstanding work in conserving our natural resources.



National Water Quality Initiative, NWQI

NWQI is once again open for applications. This program was established in 2012 as a joint initiative with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as a way to address sources of water pollution including nutrients, sediment, pesticides, and pathogens related to agricultural production. If you operate or are a land owner in the Goodman Creek Watershed, you are eligible to apply for cost share for best management

practices (BMP's) that will improve water quality. The primary resource concern for the Goodman Creek Watershed is water quality degradation.

From 2012 through 2015, there has been \$200,000 of BMPs contracted in the Goodman Creek Watershed to improve water quality. These BMP's include portable windbreaks, cover crops, fence, pipeline, tanks, wells, grassed waterways, and filter strips. For information about the program or to get an application stop in to the Beulah Field Office. To be eligible for the first batching period an application must be signed by February 19, 2016.



Scholarships Available

MCSCD is taking applications for 2016 Noxious Weed and Water Quality Scholarships. The scholarships are open to high school seniors and college students who are residents of Mercer County, North Dakota and

intend to or are currently pursuing an agricultural/natural resource management/ environmental or related field at a two or four year university in the state of North Dakota. Scholarships will be awarded in the amount of \$500.

Interested applicants are required to complete the application form and compose an essay of no more than 500 words. Applications and essays are due to the Mercer County Soil Conservation District office by April 1, 2016. For more info or applications, please contact the office.
